 - impacts and outcomes of the nominee's actions;
 - who has benefited from this initiative;
 - how the nominee's actions have inspired others;
 - the innovative aspects of the nominee's actions
2. Letter of Support
 - one or more letters of support from separate individuals or organizations familiar with the nominee's activities.
3. Current Curriculum Vitae
